## LAVTA to Recognize 4 Millionth Hacienda Wheels Bus Rider

The four millionth passenger will be selected at approximately 3:40 p.m. Supervisor Haggerty will speak briefly about the success of the ECO Pass Program and the benefits of private/public partner-

ships before rewarding the lucky four millionth rider.

"We are pleased to celebrate the 4 millionth Hacienda Wheels bus rider. With the ECO pass program, taking these 4 million trips on transit instead of in a single-occupant vehicle, driving an average of 17.5 mile commute per week day avoided almost 8 million tons of carbon dioxide emissions being produced and 70 million vehicle miles traveled since 1989. LAVTA's partnership with the Hacienda Owners Association is a model to deliver a convenient and affordable commute alternative that helps air quality and reduces traffic congestion," said Supervisor Haggerty, Chair of the Livermore Amador Valley Transit Authority (LAVTA) which operates the WHEELS bus service.
